1. The first player rolls the dice, then counts out pennies according to the number on the dice.
2. The same player places the pennies in the Pennies column on their game chart.
3. Each player continues to take a turn.
4. When a player obtains ten pennies, they exchange the pennies for a dime (or a player designated as the banker does).
5. The player places the dime in the dimes column of the game mat and leaves the remaining pennies in the Pennies column.
6. Once a player obtains ten dimes in the Dimes column they exchange the ten dimes for a dollar and are proclaimed the winner of the game.

1. The first player rolls the dice, then counts out pennies according to the number on the dice.
2. The same player places the pennies in the Pennies column on their game chart.
3. Each player continues to take a turn.
4. When a player obtains ten pennies, they exchange the pennies for a dime (or a player designated as the banker does).
5. The player places the dime in the dimes column of the game mat and leaves the remaining pennies in the Pennies column.
6. Once a player obtains ten dimes in the Dimes column they exchange the ten dimes for a dollar and are proclaimed the winner of the game.
